
About Us



COGNITIVE DEVELOPMENT

Cognitive development is defined as how children think, explore, and understand the world around them. More specifically it refers to the process of developing intellectual abilities such as memory, attention, language, reasoning, problemsolving, imagination and understanding. Developing cognitive skills is important because they support independence, confidence and encourages learning connections between school and life.

SOCIAL EMOTIONAL

Social emotional development is critical in early childhood. Children learn to interact with others, manage their emotions and strengthen their ability to form and maintain relationships. Children learn to identify & name emotions as well as how to manage them. They recognize others' emotions and begin to understand empathy. They begin to gain a sense of "Self" and increase independence. Students learn to make friends and practice important social skills.
